The short course season in Wisconsin has come to a close with the completion of the **State Meet March 23**. There was an excellent turnout of 130 registered swimmers, the most in at least 5 years. I want to personally thank all the swimmers that attended the local meets. There was a good turnout throughout the season, and it helps the local hosts run successful meets.

The next event in Wisconsin will be the **Fun Meet in Brookfield on June 1**, which includes every swimmer's favorite 25s. There will be a swim clinic preceding the meet that will focus on starts and relay exchanges, just in time for short course nationals. It would also be a good time for last-minute tune-ups.

This year will feature a 1000 M and 1500 M swims, with wetsuit and non-wetsuit categories. ### WMSC vs WISC

### What's the Difference

WMSC is the acronym for Wisconsin Masters Swim

Committee, which is governed under the rules of US Masters

Swimming (USMS). The Committee is part of the 51 local

masters swim committees under USMS. We abide by the

mission and rules of USMS, and have been granted non-profit

(501 (c)(3)) status under USMS. The mission statement of

USMS is to: "Empower adults to improve their lives through

swimming."

WMSC has its own set of by-laws, a copy of which may be viewed here.

Per USMS rules, we must hold an Annual Meeting once a year, and Wisconsin has chosen to hold its meeting in the Fall of each year.

WMSC supports the sport of swimming as defined in the rules of USMS, and makes sure our competitions are run according to those rules. We also provide 6 newsletters each year for all members, disseminate rule changes or interpretations from USMS, and provide a sanctioning process for meets and open water events.

WISC is the name for Wisconsin Masters Aquatic Club. With its own leadership, the Club organizes the meet schedule each year, along with being the organizing entity for our state's competition at nationals. WISC is a Regional Club, which means it competes as a region (typically states) in national competitions against other Regional Clubs. Anyone who is a member of WMSC can opt in to be associated with

WISC. You must be a member of WISC in order to swim on relays and have them count towards a national Top 10 Time, or compete on relays at nationals. WISC is also the entity that organizes the coaches for nationals, as well as assigns swimmers to relays.

WISC has its own incorporation in the state of Wisconsin, and has its own elected board and by-laws. Any swimmer who is a member of WISC can attend the WISC meetings.

Remember, WMSC is under USMS, and carries out the mission of USMS. WISC is the Regional Club designed for competition at USMS national meets. Both entities have their own elected boards. Any swimmer can run for an elected or appointed committee in WMSC, but only those included in WISC (which is most, but not all Wisconsin swimmers) can run for elected positions on their board.

I know this can be confusing, especially when you see many of the same faces, but there is a difference. If you would like a further explanation, please contact me at WIChair@usms.org.

## **Sun Prairie Short Course Yards Meet 2/11/24**

The Water Wolves Masters meet at Sun Prairie was a great meet, which ran perfectly, with no glitches - at least none that 34-year-olds find I saw - from beginning to end. The meet was held at a brandnew pool, everything spiffy and clean, with great natural lighting. The scoreboard worked perfectly throughout and gave your results instantly to the hundredth of a second. The deep end was over 12 feet deep, so plenty of room there -- you didn't have to worry about hitting the bottom when diving in.

Did I mention it was inexpensive? I swam two races and the total cost of this meet for me was seven dollars. I asked Meet Director Steve Justinger why the costs were so low, and he said a grant from WMSC subsidized the fees as a deliberate strategy to attract more swimmers. If you missed this meet, you missed the bargain of the century in a new pool where everything worked!

However, a lot of people did not miss this meet. Eighty-six swimmers showed up. I believe I was seeing more new faces than usual, with 14 one-event entries. The average age of this group of 14 one-event wonders was 32. Do these folks network on TikTok and steer each other to bargains? The two youngest swimmers at the meet, Hailey Sieren and Mason Konopacki, were both 18. Welcome to Wisconsin Masters Swimming to Hailey, Mason, and all the youthful oneeventers!

I want to mention one young swimmer who stands out with his talent and speed at every meet. That is Kevin Van Cleave. He has his mom Julie to thank for his talent, and I'm sure he does this often. Kevin was a star at Washington University where the kids are so brainy you wouldn't think they could find time for athletics. But Kevin was a 10-time All American and 6-time UAA Conference swimming champion. Kevin started out with the 400 IM and exhibited extreme grace and power through all strokes. Keep it up, Kevin!

Did the 30the competition unusually difficult? There were 14 people in that age group, followed by the 25-29 crew with 13. Overall this was



a younger meet than is typical, with just under 50 swimmers under 50, and not quite 40 swimmers over 50. Some of the new swimmers were up for trying something new, including the 50 IM and the 150 IM. The latter could be done with up to 75 yards of any individual stroke.

But the older group was well represented. We may have our foibles and memory and balance problems, but generally we made it to the blocks when we were supposed to. I want to shout out to a group of swimmers whose meet attendance is excellent and whose support makes WISC possible: Dean, Keith, Lawrence, Richard, Bobby, Jennifer, Timothy, Julie, Tom, Greg, Ann, Suzi, and Francisco - and Dave. The average age of this crowd was upwards of 65. We don't need last names any more than Beyonce does, and we might not remember them anyway.

The oldest swimmer at the meet, Larry Mueller, first appeared in the USMS database not quite 10 years ago and he's been competing through his seventies. Before Sun Prairie, he had participated in 66 meets and completed 277 swims. Larry has set records, and we are fortunate as a club to have swimmers such as Lawrence, with his perseverance

### **McFarland Short Course Yards Meet 3/9/24**

The 2024 Spartan Splash at McFarland High School was another successful meet in the Madison area run by Steve Justinger. And once again the price was a steal – Five bucks pool surcharge and one dollar per event! Masters swimming is a great deal anyway, especially considering its benefits in terms of health and quality of life, but who doesn't enjoy an even more amazing bargain? The 93 swimmers registered for this meet got their money's worth and then some!

Steve could not have done this without an outstanding supporting cast. Stu Schafer, the Aquatics Director at McFarland, lent his support and his pool. Stu also fielded an intrepid Masters team ("the home team" -- more on that later). The officials, Kim and Mike, got a lot of steps in as they walked the length of the pool repeatedly to monitor for rules compliance. The timers, Erin, Whitney, Mark, Tim, Jane, Carl, and Sarah, were drafted by Steve from the East YMCA Masters group. Chip Quade stepped up and learned the Hy-Tek Meet Manager System in a week. Did you all receive the heat sheet at 7:25 PM the night before the meet, barely an hour after registration closed? Such outstanding support doesn't just happen. It sets the tone for a well-organized, well-run meet which was completed in 3 hours. Did I mention Suzi Green? She measured the pool, took care of much of the paperwork, and fielded an incident involving a swimmer who sustained an injury on the way into the pool building.

The camaraderie of Masters Swimming could not have been better illustrated than in the first event, the 400 IM.

Ryan Menninga, Jason Tuschl, and Justin Sawran all came in within 5 seconds of each other and congratulated each other across the lane lines at the end of the race. In the final heat of the 100 Fly, 4 swimmers came in almost within one second of each other – they were Andrew Babcock, Michael Orwin, Jason Tuschl, and Jake Gutkes. It was like watching an Olympic

event, where races are decided by fractions of a second, and friendship reigns once the race is over!

The "home team" of McFarland swimmers (pictured here) included Justin Harrington, Kathryn Happe, Rebecca Kressner, Kris Van Handel, and John Peirce. At age 75, you might think John had been competing for a while. But he joined Masters swimming last December and started competing in January. Prior to McFarland John had completed 7 US Masters swims. His age-matched opponent was Francisco Lopez, who has been competing for 18 years and who now swims with White-fish Bay Masters. Francisco had completed 236 swims prior to McFarland. So who won, John or Francisco? My answer would be they both did. How do I know so much about these swimmers? Just check the USMS website and click on "Events," then "Results and Rankings," and "Track my Results." (I can watch myself slow down as I age up).

There were four coaches at the meet, each of whom

Thanks go to Meet Director **Steve Justinger**, who doesn't compete as much as he used to, but stands tall as a Wisconsin swimming legend. **Jerry Lourigan** and **Chip Quade** ran the technology, and we owe them a debt of gratitude for a meet so well run it was easy to take it for granted. **Susan Wagner** and **Stewart Oliver** did great officiating. And the timers from **Sun Prairie YMCA** were dedicated and generous enough to donate their time. My timer, in lane 3, always had a kind word to say about my swims, no matter how much I deviated from the technique of Phelps and Thorpe.

attracted a school of swimmers. Justin Harrington recently led McFarland to the D2 State Championship. There was also Tim Capps (Baraboo), Justin Sawran (Oregon), and Carl Millholland (Monona). These coaches all had challenging swim schedules, led in terms of brutality by Carl Millholland, who started out with the 400 IM and ended with the 500 Free. He also had a winning race in the 150 IM. By showing the way for their swimmers, these coaches exemplified the spirit of Coach Angie O'Donnell, the namesake of the McFarland pool.

Coach O'Donnell died tragically from cancer in 2011. Her unbounded spirit lives on in the many staff and volunteers who made this meet possible, in the coaches who brought in many new swimmers, and to all those who swam their best in each event. Her motto befits this gem of a meet: "Every Day Counts."
